The "Gender Medicare Gap"



There was a recent article in "Women's Agenda" that reports on how women are paying more health services than men. In this article, the focus is on ultrasound services, where ultrasounds are used to examine lumps in the testicles and breasts (with similar complexity) yet scrotum ultrasounds attract a higher government rebate than breast ultrasounds. This imbalance is also seen with pelvic ultrasounds, which are more complex than a scrotum ultrasound but this also received less. As such, women will pay more for their ultrasound. This gap is compounded when complex conditions that require a specialist service.

Perinatal Mental Health: Supporting Transitions, Fostering Compassion -6th September 2022

Making Sense of the Unseen: A grounded theory study of women's experiences of suicidality during pregnancy and the following year

Speaker: Dr Laura Biggs, midwife and Research Fellow in the Refugee and Migrant Health Research Program Intergenerational Health Group, Murdoch Children's Research Institute.

Laura shared findings from a recent grounded theory study with 139 women which sought to explain how suicidality evolves during pregnancy and the following year.

The developed theory holds shame as a core concept. Origins and contexts of shame reflect current epidemiological understandings of risk for perinatal suicide, including experiences of gender-based violence, adverse childhood experiences, and a history of mental health difficulties. When women feel that they are defective, unworthy of love and belonging, and do not possess what it takes to be a good mother, they can conclude that their family is better off without them. In contrast, pathways beyond shame can be facilitated by compassionate and rehumanising experiences of care and support from family, friends, and care providers.

The study helps to address an urgent need to generate deeper understandings of suicidality during pregnancy and the following year, including how recognised risk factors for suicide operate within women's lives and within health care interactions.

Speaker: Clare Bellhouse, Dept of Psychiatry, University of Melbourne.

Clare's spoke about how the transition to parenthood requires significant psychological, social, cognitive and biological adaptation. Successfully navigating this period is critical for maternal mental health, infant development and the development of the parent-infant attachment relationship. Her project examines the complex transition and the experiences of this for mothers at a high-risk of experiencing difficulties. Understanding the experience of women at risk in this transition can assist

in identifying women who may require intervention in pregnancy to assist in trying to prevent disturbances in the parent-infant relationship. It includes a novel psychological intervention, the Supporting Transitions, Attachment and Relationships (STAR Mums) program, a psychodynamic attachment-based group intervention, for pregnant women with risk factors for attachment difficulties. The STAR Mums program aims to provide intervention during pregnancy to assist women identified as having risk factors in the transition to parenthood with the desired outcome to support a healthy transition to parenthood and to reduce some of these risk factors.

Participants and facilitators reported high acceptability with high levels of engagement and participation. The group helped them to feel less isolated and also provided a model for reflecting on the baby and the significant changes required to adapt to the parenthood role. Participants spoke about subjective reductions in their anxiety levels and finding the mindfulness exercises helpful in connecting with their babies and managing their anxieties in the longer-term once the group finished. Overall, the findings suggest the program appears acceptable and facilitates reflection for participants. This work provides an important first step in developing an intervention which provides an opportunity for women at risk to begin to work through issues which may impact their relationship with their infants before they are born, a true form of early intervention.
